## Flectra

There has been a lot of publicity about cyber risks. The Flectra system is covered for Cyber insurance under the master policies. Please note that insurance does not extend to cover for other online systems as the cover should be provided by the online system provider.

## Insurance

The Public liability insurance expires on 30 June and is being extended to expire on the 31st of December.

Please note the advice above relating to cyber insurance cover and Flectra.

On event insurance, additional to the master Public Liability cover, if needed that cover is available **if YOU ARE RUNNING AN EVENT which involves** traffic management or risk to the public from any machinery, equipment or sporting equipment please file a Helpdesk ticket which get automatically routed to the National District Insurance Officer team. Usually your query will be allocated to your District Insurance Officer (DIO) but if your DIO is away or unavailable one of the other members of the DIO will be allocated to help you.

Travel insurance for Rotary related travel is also available.

Rotary Youth Exchange cover is available for Districts and their Clubs that are active with Rotary Youth Exchange.

## Donated Flood Money update

### *Rotary donated money was able to help;*

*"The whānau had to be relocated so many times to different hotels and were even placed out in Pukekohe. Last month, this whānau had finally been placed into a permanent home in Otara. However, due to all their belongings being damaged during the floods, they were left with nothing. Would love to give a bed for the young boy and a washing machine and blankets please if I can."*



Approximately \$193,000 has feed through the Rotary Oceania Account for Flood relief for Districts 9910,9920 and 9930.

Rotary in District 9920 and the Kindness Collective have been working together over the last few weeks asesing and distributing goods to those affected by flooding.

In the first week of working the money raised from donations has purchased and dispatched pyjamas and for flood-affected tamariki. The full order for Port Waikato (420 pairs) has been sent from Waikato Women's Refuge who is distributing it for us to the iwi organisation and families. We've also provided the Refugee Centre with another 400 pairs through the PJ Project as a separate delivery for Hamilton.

During the second week The Kindness Collective have spent:

\$4,336 on food

\$4,573 on whiteware

\$940 on 2 x car seats and 1 x cot

\$4174 on extra bedding

A lot of our families coming through in the last 6 days are refugees and migrants from Kāhui Tū Kaha, MDM, Family Start, ProCare Here Toi and Mangere Family Services.

Some really sad stories of families only arriving a year ago, getting set up from the community, having homes and complexes flooded, losing most uninsured possessions and then moving into emergency motels, then transitional houses not suited for their families, moving a few times all across Auckland and now settled in very South Auckland, where they were once in Avondale. So many families are still struggling with the basics.



**Flood Appeal Update**

*Thank you / The Kindness Collective are working with Rotary to help families across the Auckland greater area.*

They have had 41 weather-affected whānau to whom we've provided resources, including a new bed, washing machine, dryer, a cot, four car seats, 23 blankets, food boxes, and four heaters. We've also got 'I am Mangere' sending through a food box and blanket order for their flood-affected families
